

- 1. How did the citizens of Nanking know an attack was beginning/coming, & how did the population in Nanking react?
- 2. Why did people, both Chinese & non-Chinese, stay behind in Nanking when they knew the Japanese armed forces were coming?
- 3. Why were the Japanese so interested in Shanghai? And then Nanking?
- 4. What evidence, from the period, exists that PROVE the events in & around Nanking took place? (Please provide FOUR different types)
- 5. What specifics atrocities did the Japanese armed forces commit against the Chinese?
- 6. Describe the significance & operations of the "Safety Zone"/"Neutral Zone."
- 7. Did any foreigners stand out because of their heroic acts on behalf of the Chinese? Explain.
- 8. Provide FIVE examples of Japanese aggression once Imperial Japanese forces actually entered the city.
- 9. How were women particularly targeted & taken advantage of?
- 10. Why do you think that Japan has had, & still has, a very difficult time admitting what happened at Nanking?
